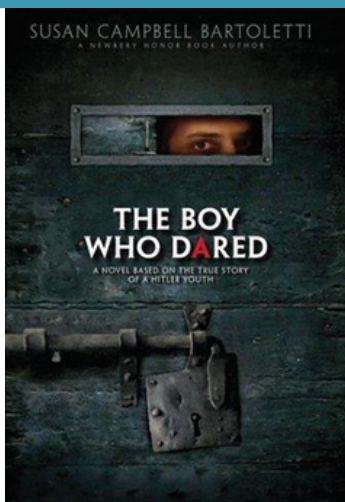


BOOK REVIEW
