Things That Go! Suggested Supplementary Activities

Finger- Plays And Sing-Along-Songs

<u>I'm a Little Airplane</u> (tune "I'm a little Teapot")

I'm a little airplane, (Children raise arms at sides to shoulder height) Now watch me fly! (They spin one of their arms in front of them as if it were a propeller) Here are my instruments From down low to up high (With their other arm, they reach from the around to above their heads.) First I get revved up. (Children make engine noises while still spinning their arms.) Then I can fly (Children raise arms to shoulder height.) Lifting off the runway (They start walking forward.) Up into the sky! (They go up on their tiptoes and continue to move forward. Let them circle awhile before returning to their original positions)

Row, Row, Row Your Boat

Row, row, row your boat, Gently down the stream, Merrily, Merrily, Merrily, Merrily Life is but a dream.

Choo-Choo Train (adapted)

Choo-choo-choo The train puffs down the track. (Bend arms at elbows and imitate chugging) Now it's going forward. (Chug leaning forward) Now it's chugging back. (Chug arms back to sitting position) Now the whistle blows. (Imitate pulling chain of train whistle up and down.) Chugging, chugging, chugging, chugging. (Move bent arms back and forth) Down the track it goes!

The Wheels on the Bus

Children perform actions and sounds suggested by the words The wheels on the bus go round and round,

Round and round, round and round The wheels on the bus go round and round All through the town.

The driver of the bus says Move on Back! Move On Back! Move On Back! The driver of the bus says Move On Back! All through the town

The people on the bus go up and down, up and down, up and down. The people on the bus go up and down all through the town.

Craft Boat Building Fun

Supplies Needed

- Paper or plastic plates
- plastic tubs
- construction paper
- glue
- tape
- string
- scissors
- plastic straws



Directions

- 1. Set out a variety of materials for "boat building," such as paper and plastic plates, small plastic tubs, paper, cardboard tubes, paper cups etc.
- 2. Cut paper into squares to make sails.
- 3. Use a straw to make the mast.
- 4. Use tape, glue and yarn to complete the boat.
- 5. Let the children use their imaginations and experiment with different materials to find which materials make the best boats.





Egg Carton Train


Supplies Needed

- Egg carton

Directions


- 1. Cut the egg carton lengthwise.
- 2. Give each child a row of six egg cups.
- 3. Have the children turn the egg cups upside down and paint them to make a train.
- 4. Let the carton dry. Once dry have the children add finishing details like windows, wheels or smokestacks.
